# SENATE FINANCE COMMITTEE AMENDMENT – MEDICAID SERVICES SDS SEPARATE APPROPRIATION

Home and Community Based Services and Personal Care Services providers recognize the challenges faced by the State of Alaska in managing growing Medicaid costs. These providers desire to be part of the solution without taking disproportionate rate reductions in comparison to other Medicaid funded sectors. Therefore, the previous request for a separate appropriation is amended as follows:

- 1. Establish a separate Medicaid Appropriation of \$524,968,700 for Medicaid SDS services in the FY2020 Budget, and
- 2. Include intent language which prevents the Commissioner of DHSS from making further provider rate reductions or transfers from the Medicaid SDS Services appropriation.

## Reasons:

- Apply a \$50 million (8.7%) reduction the FY19 Medicaid SDS Budget Allocation of \$574,968,700 to establish the FY20 appropriation. This satisfies the OMB requirement of \$50M to fund the separate appropriation, and substitutes the DHSS proposed 5% provider rate reduction
- Medicaid Payment Analysis, FY18 Medicaid Actual Cost to FY18 Budget Allocations shows:

Behavioral Health Actual \$235M Budget \$140M Over Budget \$95M Health Care Actual \$1,399M Budget \$971M Over Budget \$320M Senior & Disability Actual \$457M Budget \$550M Under Budget \$92M Cutbacks in services to vulnerable Alaskans have been funding Medicaid Expansion

- Lack of Parity among Medicaid Provider Rates: Per DHSS Office of Rate Review, only Community Behavioral Health, Ambulatory Surgical Centers, Home and Community Based/Personal Care Services, and Infant Learning Targeted Case Management Services have <u>not</u> received rate rebasing in the past five fiscal years
- Senate Finance DHSS Budget Subcommittee recommended \$82.6M reductions are applied to actual growth areas of Behavioral Health and Health Care Services

EXPLANATION: This amendment **REDUCES** funding for Senior and Disabilities Medicaid Services by \$50 million / 8.74% from the FY19 \$574, 968,700 allocation amount and places it in a **separate appropriation for increased transparency**. Reason: This effectively transfers over 50% of the current Medicaid SDS service allocation that <u>DHSS has been using (\$92.3 million in FY18) to subsidize Medicaid expansion growth</u>. A separate appropriation stabilizes long term supports for vulnerable Alaskan seniors and those who experience disabilities. **This amendment is supported by:**

Under "AI: Medicaid Services" insert new paragraph:

### Intent

It is the intent of the legislature to hold harmless Skilled Nursing Facilities, and Senior and Disabilities Services providers (Nursing Homes, 1915(c) and Other Waiver Services, and Personal Care Services) who serve vulnerable Alaskans from the 5% Medicaid rate reduction proposed by Department of Health and Social Services.

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# <u>Medicaid Rate Parity for State of Alaska FY2020 Medicaid Budget: Senior & Disability</u> Services

Provider rates are typically adjusted through Rate-rebasing, and Inflationary adjustments:

- Rate-rebasing affords a regular review of the actual cost of doing business and adjusts rates accordingly.
- Inflation adjustments address cost increases for the lag time between cost reporting and associated rate-rebasing.

Comparison of Medicaid provider rate adjustments for **five fiscal years (FY15 to FY19)** may be summarized as follows:

- Community Behavioral Health Services Rates received <u>no rate-rebasing</u> and a 3% increase in FY18 (while awaiting completion of a rate setting methodology), having <u>received no inflationary adjustments in earlier years.</u>
- Senior and Disability Services Rates are regulated under Alaska Administrative Code (7 AAC.145)
  - Nursing Homes received rate-rebasing in 4 fiscal years and inflation adjustments between 2.4% and 3.2% in 2 fiscal years
  - ♦ Home and Community Based/Personal Care Services received <u>no rate-rebasing</u> and inflationary adjustments of 2.4% and 2.5% in 2 fiscal years.
  - Infant Learning Targeted Case Management Services received <u>no rate-rebasing</u> and inflationary adjustments of 2.7% and 2.7% in 2 fiscal years.
- Health Care Services Rates are regulated under Alaska Statute (Title 47, Chapter 07).
  - Physician Services are set using the Resource Based Relative Value Scale

- ♦ Federally Qualified Health Centers received rate-rebasing in 4 fiscal years and inflation adjustments of 2.5% and 2.7% in 2 fiscal years
- ♦ Inpatient Hospitals received **rate-rebasing in 4 fiscal years** and inflation adjustments between 2.4% and 3.2% in 2 fiscal years
- ◆ Ambulatory Surgical Centers received <u>no rate-rebasing</u> and inflationary adjustments of 2.4% and 2.8% in 2 fiscal years

*	These are provider specific rates and some of the providers are rebased, but not all providers are rebased each year.
**	These services are set using Resource Based Relative Value Schedule (RBRVS). These services are not rebased in the typical sense, but the methodology does require the Department to update the federal Relative Value Units (RVU) and Geographic Price Index (GPCI) from the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services that are federally set each year.
***	FQHCs who opt to receive a rate under the Prospective Payment System (PPS) and not the Alternative Payment Methodology (cost-based), are not rebased. They receive inflation each year it is granted.
****	The inflation for capital and non-capital is not additive, each inflationary component applies to its respective capital or noncapital portion of the rates.

****	Community Behavioral Health services received a 3% increase while awaiting completion of a rate setting methodology since their service category did not receive inflation in any of the earlier years.
N/A	These service categories did not have annual inflation as part of their rate setting methodologies.
