#### It's not just Alaska



- 66% of Americans who became unemployed during the pandemic are not actively looking for work
- 20% have altered their livelihood so they don't have to work at all or just part-time
- Among those currently unemployed who have held multiple jobs since April 2020, 60% lasted less than three months in their most recent job.
- 49% of respondents are not willing to take jobs that do not offer the opportunity for remote work.

### Seed #1 = The workers are not coming back
