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
Project Description

- Funded by the federal Administration for Community Living (ACL)
- 5 year project timeline
- Focused on training

Alaska's Landscape Analysis

Information Gathering

- 15 IDD and Co-occurring Mental Health Advisory Council members
- 2 Leadership Education in Neurodevelopmental and related Disabilities (LEND) Fellows
- 44 interview participants
- 75 Alaska Mental Health and Developmental Disabilities (MHDD) Needs Assessment survey respondents
- 30 Virtual Summit attendees (18 new to the project)
- Internet searches
- Literature reviews



What Did We Learn From The Landscape Analysis?



Some Themes Identified by Participants

- Overshadowing
- Declined services
- Limited resources
- Lack of coordination
- Unpleasant treatment

- Accessibility needs
- Treatment of Direct Support
 Professionals
- Financial issues
- Availability in rural areas



Training Concerns

- Siloed training
 - Mental health and behavioral health providers not trained in IDD
 - IDD workforce is not trained in mental health
 - First responders not trained in both
- Need to put integrated training into policy
 - Later developed by Virtual Summit participants to become integration into University courses



Landscape Analysis In Action: The Training Plan



Training Plan Process

- Landscape Analysis report completed and shared December 2022
- Presented to MHDD Advisory Council
- MHDD Advisory Council worked with UAA CHD staff to further detail the training plan
- Draft Training Plan created and reviewed by MHDD Advisory Council
- Training Plan finalized and distributed

Timeline

- Year 1 of grant
 - Landscape Analysis and Virtual Summit
- Year 2 of grant
 - Training Plan written and published
 - Initial training began March 2023 August 2023
- Priority training areas identified for Year 2:
 - Mental Health Clinicians
 - Direct Support Professionals

Learn about the sources and effects of trauma, how to help people heal, and how to support individuals with IDD to develop a positive identity

People with IDD:

- Are more likely to suffer discrimination and abuse than the general population
- Experience the same range of mental health concerns as everyone else
- Are often told what they are not rather than focusing on their strengths

Total Online & In Person Trainings

- From March to August 2023
- 44 hours of training conducted
- 1,592 session attendees
 - 604 unique attendees
- Incentives
 - 996 hours worth of attendance certificates
 - 338 NASW-AK contact hour certificates
- 59 free workbooks provided



Pilot Project

- Technical Assistance from one agency with integrated services to another
 - On site training, one-on-one meetings



Next Steps

- Met with MHDD Advisory Council September 2023 to determine focus for Grant Year 3 trainings
- To inform Year 3 trainings
 - Landscape Analysis and Training Plan
 - Lessons learned from Year 2 trainings
 - Integrate more trainers with lived experience
 - Offer practical tools and methods
- Update Training Plan and re-distribute



Some FY24 Trainings Being Organized

- New MHDD ECHO series
- Training how to adapt mental health therapy/counseling
 - For those providing mental health or substance use treatment
- In person workshops across various Alaskan locations on trauma informed support
- Strategies to help with de-escalation and crisis prevention
- Train the trainer workshops to train DSP or mental health clinicians
